Marjorie Virginia Stewart Kilpatrick, age 97 of Conyers, died Sunday, December 9, 2018. Virginia was born in Milledgeville, GA on March 17, 1921. She was the oldest of five children. After high school graduation she applied for admission to nursing school in Birmingham, AL. She finished training in three years and returned home to begin her dream career at Emory Hospital. Soon she worked for the first clinic established in the Rockdale County Health Department and was later asked to set up the nursing department at the soon-to-be-built Rockdale Hospital. Years later she retired as Director of Nursing Services at Crawford Long Hospital from a career spanning 35 years. Virginia was married to her husband, Josh for 52 wonderful years before his death in 1994. Both were loyal members of Crossroads United Methodist Church.
