Carol was a proud graduate of the illustrious and tenacious South Carolina State University, where she cultivated a lifelong commitment to education, service, and leadership. Her passion for giving back extended well beyond her college years, as she remained an active and dedicated member of the South Carolina State University Alumni Chapter serving as the Parliamentarian for both the National and Atlanta Chapter. Through this organization, she worked tirelessly to mentor students, raise scholarship funds, and strengthen the bond among alumni. She believed in the power of education to transform lives and took great pride in helping young scholars reach their full potential.

A Lifetime of Service and Impact

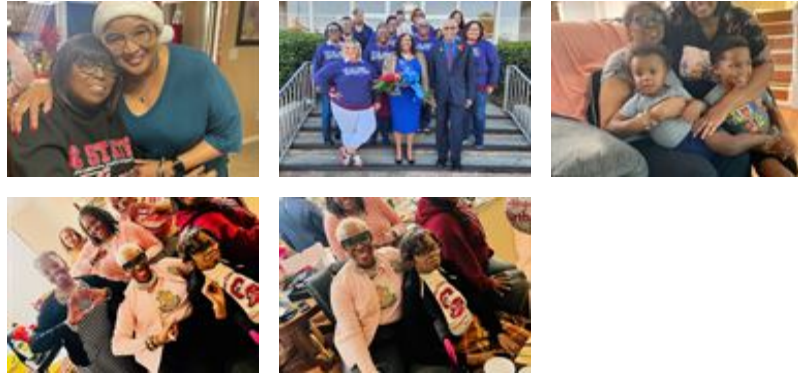
