May 27, 1936 - November 21, 2014

Mr. Charles O. Cope, age 78 of Conyers, died Friday, November 21, 2014. He is survived by his wife, Elizabeth Cope; sons and daughters-in-law, Charles Andrew (Drew) and Pam Cope, all of Conyers, Richard Ashley and Delane Cope, Lilburn; sister, Martha Smith, N. Charleston, SC; grandson, Brandon Cope. Charles was a member of First Baptist Church of Conyers, where he served as an active deacon and teacher of the PAL Sunday School Class for 15 years. He was in the first graduating class of Wade Hampton High School and received his BA from Newberry College and a Master's Degree in English from the University of Georgia. Mr. Cope taught at Rockdale High School for 35 years and was the yearbook sponsor for 28 years. Funeral Services will be held Tuesday, November 25, 2014 at 2 p.m. at First Baptist Church of Conyers with Dr. John Wyatt officiating; entombment will follow at Green Meadow Memorial Gardens Mausoleum. Family will receive friends Monday, November 24, 2014 from 4 until 8 p.m. at the funeral home.
