“ So many memories... back when we knew him as Chuck, he was an essential part of any gathering of our circle of comic fans, which like any group of friends, grew to be more than that.

Memories include our road trip to Boston, where I asked him to hold the cash for the rental car (because he was the most reliable in our group) and then dropped him off in New York having forgotten to retrieve it... not realizing until I was well on the road back to college in Washington, DC. Back in the days before the Internet or Fedex... him insisting on bringing me to see the Rocky Horror Picture Show, which resulted in me spending a summer taking the Congressional interns living in the dorm I managed to RHPS in DC (wish I could remember which ones in case they've since run for office)... parties, amusement parks, and more.

Chip also drew the cover for the last large project I did for the amateur publishing alliance to which we both belonged, INTERLAC. He drew many other great pieces for INTERLAC that had nothing to do with me save for my enjoyment.

Facebook made it possible for us to be in frequent touch even though we were on opposite sides of the country, and Chip was always aware of other people, worrying when someone hadn't posted in a few days and running them down to make sure they were okay. He also adopted our late friend Chris's dog after Chris's death, and then regaled us with tales of bonding with the feral cat he named Gypsy.

The last two times I saw Chip were too long time ago... at the 1992 Reunion fan event we put on in North Carolina, and the last time on a business trip to Atlanta, where he and I yammered in the hotel bar for hours while my spouse was off being professional. But I had only responded to a Facebook post minutes before getting word that Chip had left us.

To his family, my condolences; to our friends in common, there's

little doubt that we'll remember him fondly any time we get together.

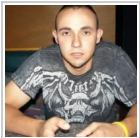
