



## Glen Theodore Bloodworth

February 14, 1937 - May 1, 2025

Glen T. Bloodworth of Mansfield, GA, passed away to be with his blessed Lord Jesus Christ on Thursday, May 1, 2025.

Glen was a native of Ivey, Wilkenson County, GA. He graduated from Baldwin County High School in Milledgeville, GA, where he lettered in three sports. Following high school, he graduated from Hoke Smith Technical School in Atlanta, GA.

He received Jesus Christ as his Lord & Savior. His love of the Word and ministry led him to Immanuel Bible College and Seminary, where he served on the Board of Directors under President Dr. James I. Stewart. He began teaching teenage boys in 1962. Glen started Bus Ministry and served in that capacity in two different churches. He also taught adults of different age groups in GA and FL. In addition to these accomplishments, he served in Creative Ministries as prison evangelist under Brother Winston Menzies, spoke at Fulton County Homeless Shelter, Dekalb Regional Detection Center, and other facilities.

In honor of his favorite scripture, Glen writing two different gospel tracts with the John 3:16 Heart and Cross logo with 25,000 in print, designed Witness Car Tags with the John 3:16 Heart and Cross logo that cover half of the United States, lapel pins, and key chains.

Glen's heart was for the poor, needy, homeless, orphans and widows, proclaiming the gospel over T.V. in every way to get the gospel message out. The gospel being 1 Corinthians 15:3,4: the death, burial and resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ!

Glen's testimony: I would have died years earlier but my blessed Lord Jesus Christ, my Creator, Saviour preserved my life (kept me alive) indwelt by His Holy Spirit wrote my name in heaven in the Lamb's Book of Life. The top heart specialist in Georgia at Emory gave up on me. The Lord Jesus brought me back from death, He saved my life.

His work included being a member of The Local 85 Sheet Metal Union, draftsman and journeyman, founder and president of Lithonia Signs, Inc. and Atlanta Lithonia Signs, Inc., and co-founder of Bloodworth Brothers Restaurants, Inc. with his brother, John Bloodworth. Glen was the owner of other businesses, including buying and selling residential and commercial real estate, coastal real estate in Horseshoe Beach, FL, farms and lands, lands with minerals, and lake property.

Glen served 3 years in the Georgia Army National Guard and 4 years, 2 months in the U. S. Air Force. For this, he was recognized by The Daughters of the American Revolution.

In his free time, Glen enjoyed hunting, off-shore fishing in the Gulf of Mexico, fishing the Flats in Gulf of Mexico, and fresh water fishing. He loved living near the water. The thing he loved most was time in the Word of God, waking early each day to read and study the Bible.

Glen is survived by his wife, Emily; son and daughter-in-law, William and Cindy, and their children, Heidi, Adam, Faith and Daniel; son and daughter-in-

law, John and Lynn, and their children Elizabeth, Sarah and Hannah.
