“ I've known Becky, and her whole family, all of my life. My grandparents, Henry (Shine) Lowry and Maude Lowry, knew this wonderful family way before I was born in 1948. Her Mother and Father were two of the most precious people that ever came out of Milstead, Ga. Becky's brother, Junior, was a very handsome young man. I had a first cousin, Patricia Atcheson, that loved him so very much and she grieved over him for years after his death. I was very young when he was killed but I remember how handsome he was. Becky's sister, Charlotte, was one of the most beautiful girls in Milstead. I will never forget when Becky and Charlotte were learning how to drive. Their Daddy would let them drive the car round and around their house before he would let them get on the streets of Milstead, (which was not full of traffic.) Becky, Charlotte, and my cousin, Patricia, would sit me in the the back seat while circling their house. There are probably to this day, somewhere beneath the grass, permanent tire tracks there. I felt special because I was allowed to be a small part of this important time in their life. Even though we didn't actually go anywhere but around their house, my Mama, their Mama and my grandmother would tell them to make me sit down and make me stay in the back seat. When their Daddy finally let Becky and Charlotte drive his car to the Company Store in Milstead, I got to go along for the ride sometimes. I can remember Becky and Charlotte taking turns driving up to the Company Store with my cousin, and sometimes, they would sit me in their lap so that I could pretend that I was driving. Thank you to the precious Stallworth sisters for letting me be such an important part of their first driving experiences. Milstead was far from a major metropolis, but it was a wonderful little cotton mill village where you actually had neighbors that were close friends and were always there for each other. Even this many years later, I can close my eyes and see these two beautiful sisters, their good looking brother, (that's what we called someone back then,) and their sweet Mama and Daddy. Becky was always so funny and she kept me laughing when I was around her. She was a kidder, that's for sure. I can still remember their Mama's laugh. And she always homemade cookies for me when I would go to their house with my grandmother.

*God bless the family at this time in their lives. Although I don't live in Conyers anymore, the family has my prayers and thoughts. Prayers know no limit of time or distance.*
