



Janie C. Olsen

February 22, 1929 - November 6, 2017

Our world is a little less bright today without the presence of our dearly loved Janie Castellana Olsen. Giovanna 'Janie' Castellana Olsen of Conyers, Georgia, beloved spouse to Robert 'Bob' Olsen and matriarch to many, passed away on November 6, 2017 after a long illness.

Giovanna was born on February 22, 1929 in Tampa, Florida, the third of four children to Emanuele and Vincenza Bonanno Castellana, originally from San Biagio Platani in the Italian Region of Sicily. The family would eventually relocate to Atlanta where Janie learned to speak English, in addition to her native languages of Italian and Spanish. The Atlanta area would be her home for the remainder of her life.

Janie was proud of her Italian heritage and Catholic faith. Sadly, her father died when she was only 12. She adored her 'Papa' and missed him terribly throughout her entire life. Her two brothers, Sam and Frank, stepped in to fill the gap, providing strong, paternal love during her younger days. Her tiny yet mighty Italian mother, Vincenza, would also serve as provider and protector, taking over the family business in the wake of her husband's sudden death. The mother/daughter duo shared a particularly close bond, speaking in Italian, and loving and caring for 'la familia' and celebrating life...the Italian way.

She found the love of her life, Robert 'Bob' Olsen, Sr. on the dance floor at the

USO during the early '50s when Atlanta was flush with soldiers in uniform preparing for the Korean War. As Janie would tell the story, she was jitterbugging on the dance floor when Bob broke in. It was at that moment that the great love story of 'Janie and Bob' began.

Married for over 64 years, Janie and Bob embody the scripture passage found in Mark 10:8, 'and the two shall become one flesh.' They loved each other deeply--heart and soul--and honored and lived their marriage vows to the fullest, 'for better for worse, in sickness and in health, til death us do part.'

Janie and Bob have two birth children, Angela Olsen Martin and Robert 'Bobby' Olsen, Jr. and three grandchildren, Madison Olsen, Maxwell Jamison and Vincent Olsen. Others adopted along the way including her sister and best friend for 66+ years, Diva Maisto and husband Angelo; daughters Marisa Maisto Grant and Rena Olsen (daughter-in-law), and too many others too numerous to mention. She has a number of cousins, nieces and nephews/great nieces and nephews who held an extra special place in her heart, especially those who've helped care and serve her and Bob during her final days.

In addition to being a wonderful wife, mother, daughter, mother-in-law, aunt and friend to many, Janie enjoyed a career with the DeKalb Library System, putting her God-given talent of organization to work. She and Bob have enjoyed many close friendships over the years, got the chance to travel to Italy on multiple occasions and have been active members at St. Pius Catholic Church for 30+ years.

A Funeral Mass to celebrate Janie's life will be held at St. Pius Catholic Church in Conyers, Georgia on Friday, November 10th at 11:00 a.m. A private ceremony for family and interment to follow at Westview Cemetery.

The family would like to extend their sincerest thanks to all those who've prayed and helped carry Janie over the finish line to our heavenly Father. The loving care she received at Yellow Brick House in Lithonia, Georgia during her last year of life has been heartfelt and extraordinary. She truly lived a full, wonderful and blessed life. While our hearts are broken, we celebrate knowing she's in heaven, fully restored by the loving hand of our Father, reunited with all those who've gone on before her, and having the 'partito' of her life.
