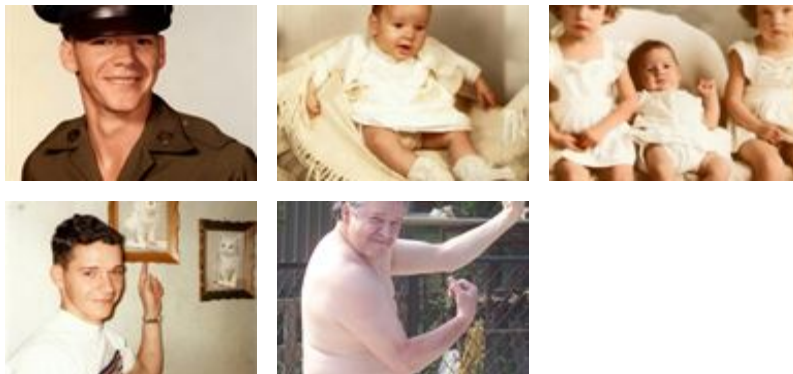

We also worked together picking purple hull peas, and butterbeans for my uncle Charlie Walden. We got 15 cents a Bushel for the peas, and 25 cents a Bushel for the butterbeans. We also got nick names from Uncle Charlie, I can't say them here, but we all did laugh at each other's nick name. There are so many stories about our younger days but not enough room to tell it all, but Frankie did remember those times all the way into his later life, and we are grateful for that.
