Lee C. Marshall, age 87 of Conyers, Georgia passed away at his home on Wednesday, June 30, 2021. Lee was born in Birmingham, Michigan on August 2, 1933 to Thomas and Doris (Agar) Marshall. The family moved to Peck, MI when he was a small boy and settled in Marlette, MI in 1945. Lee attended Sandusky High School and graduated with the class of 1952. After graduation, Lee attended college at Michigan State University. He joined the USA Air Force in order to serve his country during the Korean War. After the Air Force, Lee worked in several facets of the real estate business including as a Project Manager for the State of Georgia with the Georgia State Properties Commission from which he retired in 1998 after 25 years of service. In his career with the state, Lee was a lead contributor and negotiator for many major land deals including land for the former Georgia Dome, several expansions of the Georgia World Congress Center, expansions at the Georgia Ports Authority, and preparations and land for the 1996 Atlanta Olympic Games.

Lee had many hobbies including woodworking, traveling, fishing, and gardening. He made upwards of thirty birdhouses and dozens of pieces of furniture and knick knacks. He loved taking his family and friends out on the lake in his boat for fun times skiing and fishing, and taught many children and grandkids to do both activities. With gardening, Lee channeled his days on the farm growing up to cultivate his own fruits, vegetables, and herbs. He loved tilling the ground and using his tractor to get everything ready for another year's harvest. He loved his recreational vehicles starting with small campers and graduating up to Class A motorhomes. He loved planning trips with Ann; driving all over the United States; and having his wife and dog by his side

Lee was preceded in death by his parents, Thomas and Doris Marshall; brothers, Donald Marshall, Jerry Marshall, Dean Marshall. 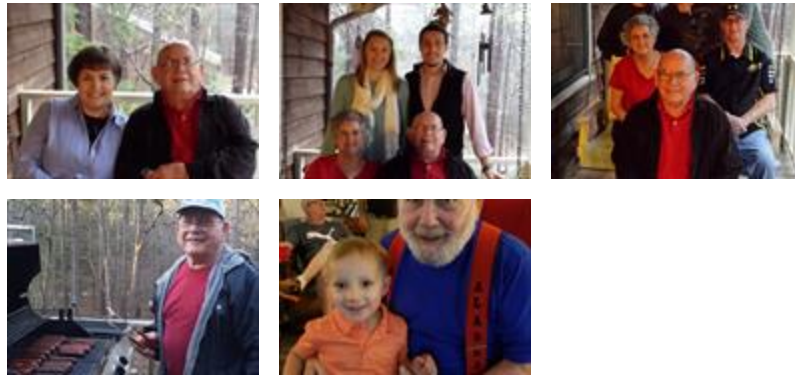
