Wesley Hawn Blocher, age 67, passed away Wednesday, April 1, 2026, at Newton General Hospital with his beloved son, Shawn, holding his hand.

Wesley was born in Ft. Worth, Texas, to Fred and Sue Blocher. Due to his father's work and many moves, he ended up in Decatur, GA, and attended Atherton Elementary and Towers High School. He then went on to become a Georgia Bulldog and graduated with a Bachelor of Arts.

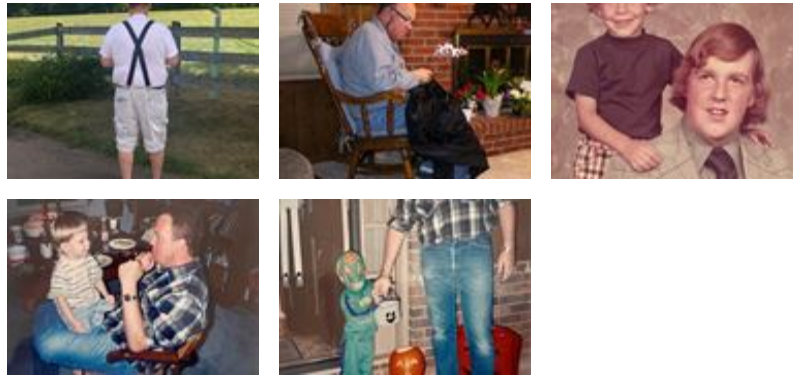
