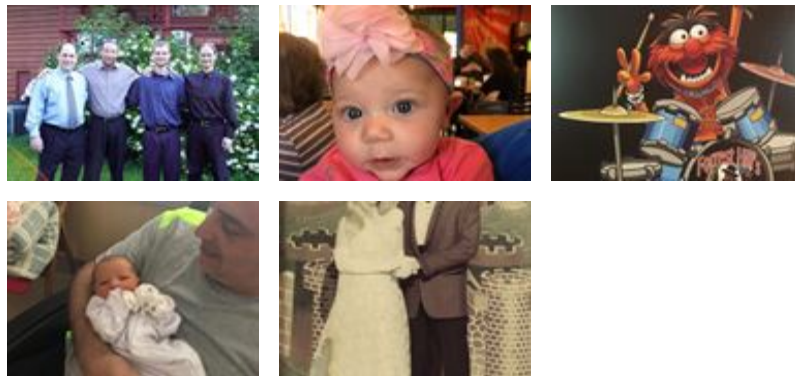

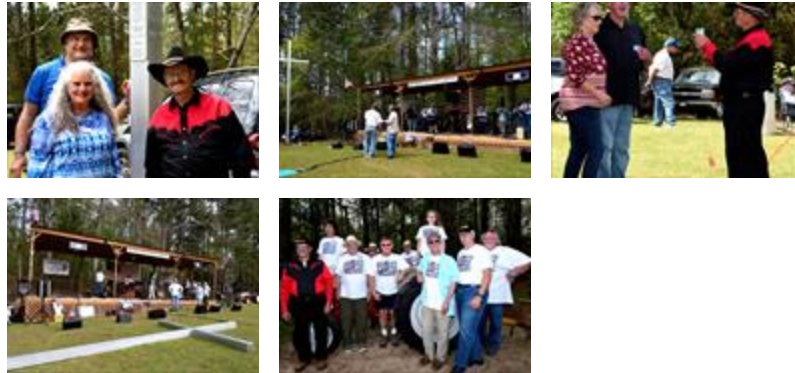


“ A few years ago I got to know Forrest responding to Facebook and some of his emails. I knew his brothers Danny and Tommy well but I was older than Forrest and did not remember him. As time went on our friendship continued to grow. I too have a great love for music and my relationship with Forrest led to the idea of the “Gang of Five.” Forrest came up with the idea of the name so he began by asking a few of us over to his house and begin playing music again. I had played in a group called the Collegiates while attending West Georgia College with his Brother Danny. It had been many years since I played a piano and my time early on with Forrest rekindled by interest in music. The initial members of the gang of five were Forrest, Phil Lazenby, Mike Russell, Glenn Johnson and myself. That first practice was one of getting to know one another and start something that none of us could imagine the impact it would have on so many people. But that is the way the Lord works. At the time I had no idea of the promoter and the leader that Forrest could be. He saw the vision from God and everyone knows the rest of the story. Others have mentioned the many people he has brought back together as a result of his efforts through his love for music and other people. I participated with the gang for the first couple of years but moved away to North Carolina to be closer to my children and grandchildren. As a result I could not be as close to the action if the festival as I once was. The only thing I can add to the conversation is that if it had not been for Forrest I would not have restored my interest in playing music again and I would not have renewed my old friendships if the past. Only the Lord knows the true value of Forrest and what he intended Forrest to be. I am also honored that Forrest chose me to write a chapter in his recent book of remembering ole Decatur. I too have been praying for Forrest every day since this very unexpected illness and I know he will be going to a better place. At some point in ours lives we all will have to make this journey and we should all use the time we have left to better ourselves, get our life in order so we can be acceptable in Gods graces just as Forrest has.

“ I knew of Forrest at Avondale High. I got to actually know Forrest maybe 10 or so years ago on Facebook. When Forrest was writing his first book about where he grew up and the surrounding area. He had asked about different places and I shared a story with him about Lake Spivey. My father built the actual lake and beach for Mr. Jake Spivey who was a dentist. When the lake was finished filled with water and fish Mr Spivey had our family to come for a picnic at the beach with his family. My dad brought an inner tube from one of his large tractors, Mr. Spivey's daughter, my older sister, older brother and I were the first to ever play in that lake. I believe that it was in the summer of 1957 when the lake opened. I I was about 2 years and 8 months old and was in a yellow polka dot bikini! Just like the song!

When the book was finished and was up for sale I had been very ill and our money was very tight. Forrest sent me a free copy of his book. I sent him a thank you note, and have loaned that book to many more folks so that they could read and reminisce about our youth at a time when growing up was the greatest time in history of the United States.

I missed the very first Music in the woods Festival due to surgery to my spine. However, my husband Alfred and I attended the next 3 held in April. Alfred was the crazy silly fellow helping to keep the food served, and rotated, so that no one got sick from food spoiled from the heat of the sun. As I found a place in the shade to listen and visit with old and new friends.

Forrest has prayed for me many times over the past 5 years as I am in Stage 4 Renal failure. He has lifted my spirits, and showed me how to have faith that God has a plan for us all.

Most of all he told me how to bring God back into my home.

Ten years ago I invited my husband to go to church with me. He always said no! One day I told him I was worried about his soul. What do you mean he asked and I told him that I had accepted Jesus as my saviour and into my life. I had been baptized and was forgiven of my sins. I knew where my soul was going when I died. But I was afraid that I would never see him in heaven.

He began going to church with me the next Sunday. About 8 months

later he accepted Jesus, and was baptized in front of the congregation.

He really got deep into reading and asking questions trying to understanding the bible. A few years ago as my health began to get really bad I was unable to attend each week. We tried to attend together but many times I was just to tired, or had another surgery. We eventually just stopped attending.

I spoke to Forrest about how difficult is was for us to attend. He said where there are two or more together you can read the bible and praise the Lord. We did not have to do this in a church we could do this in our home together. We began with prayer before breakfast, and we found several preachers on TV. We would sit together every Sunday after breakfast and would listen to 3 preachers that we enjoyed listening to. Forrest reminded me that God is always listening and watching. He knew what was in our hearts and would show us the way. Sure enough, we attend when we can, but many times especially in winter, or if I am in a lot of pain, or Forrest has showed so many how faith, and believing and trusting in God has made miracles come to pass.

He has been a great teacher, for I have learned how to bring love, peace, compassion and joy to others through sharing my own stories of miracles!

Thank you Forrest! You have touched so many lives through your faith, work, dreams, and love of others.

Rest in Peace dear friend, until we are all together again! What a wonderful Festival that will be!
